## AUDIOBOOK REVIEW CHECKLIST

The audiobook production is a collaboration between the author and the narrator, like a play is a collaboration between a playwright and the actors, so it's important to highlight the narrator(s)' performance. Here are some things you might want to consider including:

- 1. Did you get lost in the book or were there aspects that distracted you?
- 2. Could you easily differentiate between the various characters' voices in the dialogue?
- 3. Did the narrator's use of accents or other vocal characteristics add to or detract from the story?
- 4. Same with pacing?
- 5. Were there sound effects or music that added to or detracted from the story?
- 6. What emotions did the narrator make you feel? Did the narrator's emotional connection with the material enhance or detract from your experience of the story?
- 7. Was this duet, multi-cast, or dual narration? If so, did this enhance your experience or distract you?
- 8. Who else might enjoy this book and why? As in, if you like stories that \_\_\_\_\_, then you'll like this book. Or if you like the tropes \_\_\_\_\_, then you'll like this book.
- 9. Is this a "must listen"? That is, does the narrator's performance make for an unforgettable/special/affecting/memorable experience?
- 10. Be kind and specific.
- 11. Make notes while you're listening.
- 12. Pro tip: use a thesaurus app like Power Thesaurus when you're penning your review.
